Brief Introduction to the School

Shree Rastriya Higher Secondary School is located at a beautiful location named Thantibhanjyang, at the centre of Kabilas V.D.C which lies in mid- Nuwakot district of Nepal. This school is entirely dependent to the community and the students from different social backgrounds study from class Nursery to Class 12 in this school. It was a primary school when it was established, with collective and continual efforts of the contemporary social workers and youths, in 1970AD. With the course of time and with consistent efforts of the community people, this school could become a lower Secondary School in 1975AD and a Secondary School later in 1997 AD. With all possible endeavors, this school was upgraded to Higher Secondary School addressing the demands of community in 2011AD. We must remember all the supporting hands without which this development could never have happened. We had also formulated a plan to upgrade this school into a campus so that the students (mostly come from minorities and back-warded ethnic groups) of this area would be benefitted with the light of Education in near future. Unfortunately, this dream has remained incomplete and there are some very difficult obstacles to fight with. The great earthquake of April 25, 2015 destroyed almost all the physical structures of the school. Except a few of the blocks of the school, all the buildings have got destroyed and are now unsafe to run teaching-learning activities. The students and the teachers are compelled to conduct daily classes under Temporary Learning Centers(TLCs).

At present, there are 444 students studying in this school in different classes. The number of the students is as follow:

guiding them towards brighter horizons of life, with its all possible might. We feel that it is our humble and holy duty to play a crucial role in developing skilled and competent manpowers for the nation uplifting these community people.

However, the way to the realization of this dream plus duty has become extremely tough after the earthquake devastated last year. It has become very difficult to rise again and that is why we are expecting helps from various National and International helping organizations.

We would like to state the present conditions of our school's Physical Structures.

Besides a 4-roomed under-construction building and a 2 roomed reconstructed building by JICA, we don't have any safe place to learn and make learn.

Our necessity of building is very crucial. We need 26 rooms altogether for the over-all school conducts which is detailed as below.
